

DIRECTORS NOTES



Why improv?

Improv is a crucial skill in theatre, and most of the great acting teachers of years past emphasize improv as a means of training and exercise in sharpening the skills of an actor, as well as characters.

With regards to education, improv engages an incredible - arguably superior - amount of the brain, firing the synapses of complex, real-time

communication; analysis; prediction; innovation; synthesis; creativity; adaptability; negotiation; poise; social competency and interaction . . . Sounds like the very same skill areas our students need in the economy of today, and of tomorrow - All while presenting themselves in front of an audience, entertaining, and having a great time. School *is* cool.

My own first experiences in improv came from Tina Fey, through Upper Darby Summer Stage. Back in 1991, she was my first director, and she also taught an improv class. We had a great time, but we also were learning great lessons at the time. Tina always emphasized "yes, and . . ." to build a scene, and to always "try to make your partner look good". We applauded every effort, because it takes spirit and guts to put yourself out there. It is not easy to demonstrate grit, and try, try, try, and try again, and yet, that is exactly how we learn, and how we succeed - not only in improv.

Imagine if our school; our District; our neighbors; our state; our country - we all followed the improv guideline "make your fellow actors look good". I wonder what could be accomplished. In improv, there's no room for selfish actors. Scenes fall flat immediately. Harry Truman said, "It is amazing what you can accomplish when you don't care who gets the credit."

THE GAMES

THE GAMES

PARTY QUIRKS - A host of a party welcomes their guests one at a time. Each guest has a "quirk" or character, and at the end of the game, the Host has to figure out who each Guest is. **TEAMS**

THE DATING GAME - An eligible bachelor or bachelorette is chosen, and the other actors on the team become candidates for true love. Each candidate has a quirk/character, and as the candidate asks their questions, they try to figure out who each candidate is, choosing one candidate in the end. **TEAMS**

EMOTIONAL UNDERSCORE - Actors come out onstage in pairs, coming up with a scene. At some point during the scene, unexpected music or a sound effect will be heard, and the actors must immediately integrate it into their scene. **PAIRS**

NEWSCASTERS - Two people are news anchors, one person does the weather, another does sports, and one more is on location. Anchors read headlines, and improvise news stories; the weather and sports reporters each have quirks to be guessed by the anchors, and then we have an on-site reporter who has no idea where they are, but guesses it from the questions posed by the anchors! **TEAMS**

TELEPHONE CALL - Let's pretend we work for the government and spy on our citizens - We will be listening in on phone calls between two individuals. Actors present vignettes in pairs! **PAIRS**

TALKSHOW - Like the iconic television show, watch as our hosts welcome a special guest, and ask the guest questions about himself/herself - While the guest has no idea who (*or possibly what!*) they are, and have to guess by the end! **TEAMS**

WHOSE LINE IS IT, ANYWAY? - Our namesake game, in pairs the actors present vignettes, but have a card or two with a line of dialogue in their pocket. They have no idea what is on the card, but they have to integrate it into their scene! PAIRS
